Urban Life and the perils of Prescription- pill dependency

Dr. M K Unnikrishnan, Professor, NGSMIPS

People believe that prescription drugs can cure most ills. Symptoms are mistaken for diseases. Some Indian diabetics, even educated individuals, believe that everything will be 0K if you take an extra pill after a sumptuous feast. In USA, overdose of prescription drugs kills more people than traffic accidents. In 2014, as many as 1.3 million Americans needed hospitalisation to treat adverse drug reactions. Of them, more than a lakh died of the medicines they took. Even more shockingly, many deaths were preventable. Life expectancy in USA fell for three years in a row, after rising steadily from 1959 to 2014, suggesting that medicines are beginning to do more harm than good.

Dr. Vinay Prasad, Oregon Health & Science University, said that the urban pill culture is "encouraged by marketing by drug companies and a harried healthcare system". In knowledge intensive Pharma domain, 'knowledge asymmetry' is but the natural consequence of the highly abstruse, perpetually changing healthcare profession. Paradoxically (and tragically too), patients in developing countries with poor insurance cover, pay for medicines without knowing anything about what they take or why. Thus, regulation of pharma becomes the primary responsibility of the state.

Approvals come at a heavy price because regulatory diligence cannot happen without experts. Regulations add to medicine costs. Taxpayers have to pay. The role of the community Pharmacist should be evaluated in this context. India is producing and exporting medicines to more than 200 countries. And yet, India has a very poor record in drug utilisation. Pharmacy professionals do not take interest in community pharmacy. The recently introduced Pharm D programme has not succeeded optimally.

The government should consider legislations for advancing the role of community pharmacists. India has witnessed legislations that create social needs, unlike Western democracies where social needs create appropriate legislations. Indians are law abiding. For instance, take smoking behaviour. You hardly see anybody smoking today after the ban on smoking in public spaces. Political will can transform India.
