Dear Friends and Colleagues,

I was going through an interesting article based on the survey carried out in institutional level emphasising the importance of good communication skill and documentation practices in improving the employability of the students. The article suggests that communication skill and good documentation practices play vey important role in not only getting good employment but also in vertical mobility.

Indeed, it calls for a re-thinking in formulating the curriculum. There is an urgent need to ensure that the students have excellent communication and technical skills to face the challenges in their professional life. Unfortunately, the syllabus of almost all professional programmes allot very little weightage to soft skills. If we were to believe the feedback from the industry captains, and there is no reason why we should doubt their observation, it is the time for the colleges to address the problems of poor communication skills among the graduates to be internationally competitive.

I feel an effective learning course to improve reading, writing, listening, speaking and comprehension skills should be a



part of the syllabus with substantial weightage. Though some of the universities/institutions have some programmes, they remain partially effective mainly due to lackadaisical approach to the problem. A well-defined syllabus spreading across the entire duration of the programme in communication skills and good documentation practice should be introduced in all the programmes. Every institution must have a teacher/trainer to help the student to excel in these critical areas.

Having said that, I believe developing the entrepreneurial spirit among the students should be the priority area which will generate jobs. Use of robots, high degree of automation etc. reduces the human power requirement in the coming years. Obviously our focus should be job creation rather than seeking.

The academic year 2017-18 is coming to an end. I wish all the students success in the examination and to those who complete their graduation very successful career.
